What you need to know about the new Responsible Pet Ownership Bylaw No. 26 of 2018

A pet can be a wonderful addition to your family; however, owners should be aware of the responsibilities that come with having a household pet. The City of Prince Albert's new Responsible Pet Ownership Bylaw No. 26 of 2018 is in effect. Please see the below list of common offences and fine amounts.

-  Failure to license a cat or dog or failure to attach valid license when off your property.
\$75 First Offence
-  Dog or cat being at large.
\$75 First Offence
-  Unless your property, dog or cat feces must be removed immediately from public or private property.
\$75 First Offence
-  Allowing animal feces to accumulate on private property.
\$75 First Offence
-  Leaving a cat or dog unattended in a vehicle.
\$100 First Offence
-  Dogs or cats must not chase, bite or injure people.
\$100 First Offence
-  Exceeding the maximum number of animals. 5 cats & dogs total, with a max of 3 dogs.
\$75 First Offence
-  Willfully open a gate or door, untie or free an animal.
\$75 First Offence
-  Abandonment of an animal.
\$200 First Offence
-  Tease or throw things at a confined animal.
\$75 First Offence
